

If severe weather occurs such as heavy rainfalls and strong winds, take the following precautions:


- DO NOT drive through standing water on streets



DON'T FORGET TO UPDATE YOUR VOTER INFORMATION

When you made a recent move from one side of Town to the other, you most likely visited the Connecticut DMV Office to change information on your driver's license and auto registration. But did you change your mailing address with the Enfield Registrar of Voters Office?

Many residents think that by making changes to driver's license and auto registration automatically changes a person's voter registration information – it does not. The Registrar of Voters Office and its Converse voter database is a separate government entity from CT DMV.

It is very easy to change one's voter registration information. Just visit the Town of Enfield website (www.enfield-ct.gov). Click on the word "Departments" at the top of the page. Then click onto Registrar of Voters to access the ROV webpage. Download and print a "Voter Registration Form" from the ROV webpage, completely fill in the document, and mail it to ROV, Town Hall, 820 Enfield Street, Enfield, CT 06082. ROV staff will update your new mailing address, and send you a confirmation letter. The confirmation letter will specify the voting site for your new address.

Registration for camp is limited and is offered on a first come, first serve basis. Registrations will not be accepted before the registration start date. The Recreation Department will accept Online, Walk-in & Mail-in registrations. Phone registrations are not accepted. All fees must be paid in full upon registration. Don't delay, spaces are limited and fill quickly!

GRADES: Don't miss out on all the fun! Camp is for children entering grades 2 through 10 in September 2011. Proof of completing grade one is required upon registration.



NEW THIS YEAR: Participants will register for one of two age groups, entering grades 2-5 or grades 6-10. Camp activities and field trips will be different for each group allowing for more age appropriate likes and interests.

DATES: The program operates from Tuesday, July 5th through Friday August 12th. See below for weekly session information.

I would like to publicly express my appreciation to the Building Inspectors. They made numerous inspections at all hours in terrible weather conditions this winter. They climbed many ladders inspecting snow loaded roofs and responding to the emergencies caused by roof collapses.



Take a drive by 175 Freshwater Boulevard in the Industrial Park. You'll see substantial progress of a large new building to house Eppendorf Manufacturing Corporation. The company is investing \$20 million and recently announced the move of New Brunswick Scientific, an Eppendorf company, from New Jersey to Enfield.

Are you thinking of installing a swimming pool this year? You can find a link to Swimming Pool regulations on the Town of Enfield's website under the Building Department Division. These rules are intended to save lives. Any pool with a depth over 24 inches requires a permit from the building inspector. This is all about safety!
