



LOCAL REFERENDA—BALLOT NOV. 2, 2010

On August 23, 2010 the Enfield Town Council held a Public Hearing at the Town Hall to allow residents an opportunity to express their opinions regarding the proposal to Reconstruct and maintain various Town roads. An hour-long open house proceeded the council session that opened with a presentation of the roadway reconstruction project by the Town's consultant Vanasse Hangen Brustlin, Inc .

As with the previous successful road projects (Roads2000 & 2005), the roads in town were once again rated on nine pavement distresses, yielding a pavement condition index (PCI) value for each. The average PCI of all Enfield roads is 72; approximately 54 miles of roads have failing PCI grades; another 40 miles fall into the 61 – 72 PCI grade range . The cost to reconstruct and maintain all 186 miles of Enfield roads would be approximately \$45 million. However, it was determined by unanimous vote of the council members present that a Roads2010 Bond Referendum in the amount of \$27.5 million, with \$25 million of that amount to come from bonding be placed on the Nov 2, 2010 ballot to be voted on by the residents. If approved the funds would be put toward pavement preservation – crack sealing and ' thin overlay,' as well as other options – to preserve the roads already improved by the two previous major road projects.



QUESTION #1

"SHALL THE TOWN OF ENFIELD APPROPRIATE \$27,500,000 FOR RECONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR OF VARIOUS TOWN ROADS AND ROADSIDE ELEMENTS, AND AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS, NOTES OR TEMPORARY NOTES IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$25,000,000, WITH THE BALANCE FUNDED BY GRANTS AND OTHER AVAILABLE FUNDS?"

A resolution adopted by the Enfield Town Council at a meeting held on August 23, 2010 shall be submitted to a referendum vote on the voting machines or paper ballots by Town electors and qualified voters for approval or disapproval in conjunction with the election to be held on Tuesday, November 2, 2010 between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. (E.S.T.).

If approved, the resolution presented under the ballot heading above will appropriate \$27,500,000 for costs related to the reconstruction and repair of various Town roads and roadside elements, including sidewalks, pedestrian ramps and associated drainage facilities, in accordance with the Town of Enfield Pavement Management Update Report dated June 21, 2010. The Town will finance the appropriation by (i) issuing the Town's bonds or notes in an amount not to exceed \$25,000,000, (ii) using any federal, state or other grants-in-aid or other funds received for the project, (iii) using monies available in the unappropriated and unencumbered general fund cash balance (in accordance with the procedures in Chapter VI, Section 8(g) of the Town Charter), and (iv) using monies available from other sources as determined by resolution of the Town Council.

The full text of the Town Council resolution is on file and available for public inspection at the Town Clerk's Office.

The polling places used by the Town for the election shall be utilized by Town electors for purposes of the referendum vote. Voters qualified to vote who are not electors shall vote at the Enfield Town Hall. Absentee ballots will be available from the Town Clerk's Office.

Enfield Police Department Update on Underage Drinking

The towns of Enfield and Glastonbury, Connecticut have joined forces this past summer to launch a two-month radio campaign educating the public about Connecticut's Social Host law and the dangers of underage drinking. The cooperative advertising campaign, was aired on The River 105.9 FM during July and August, targeting parents and emphasizing the legal consequences of Connecticut's social host laws. The summer radio campaign was sponsored by the Enfield Together Coalition (ETC) and Glastonbury Alcohol and Drug Council (GLAD).

"Providing teens with alcohol will not be tolerated," Enfield's Chief Sferrazza said. "Parents - Don't provide, don't ignore and don't excuse underage drinking. It's really that simple."

It is illegal to host underage drinking parties in Connecticut and violators are subject to fines, imprisonment or both. Research shows that parents who talk with their children about the dangers of underage drinking and other unhealthy activities have a strong, positive impact on a young person's behavior and choices.

Listeners may continue to go to the radio station's Web site, www.1059theriver.com, to connect to State's underage drinking prevention site, SetTheRulesCT.org. The SetTheRulesCT campaign offers the latest information on the Connecticut's Social Host laws, the impact of alcohol on the teen brain as well as local and national resources.

Now that teens are back to school the ETC will continue to maintain the media messages regarding CT's social host laws and "Love Them Enough To Say No – Don't Provide Teens Alcohol," while collaborating with Enfield Police Department to increase enforcement activities and media outputs about enforcement.


