What is the Early Intervention Team (EIT)?


The Enfield EIT is a program designed to identify and intervene with youth experiencing behavioral, social, emotional, developmental or academic difficulties at home, school or in the community.

The goal of the EIT is to connect youth and families to services that will assist children in being successful and happy at home, at school, and in the community.

The EIT was developed to reduce the risk of youth becoming involved in the Juvenile Justice System by keeping them connected and engaged to school and positive community supports.

What issues does the EIT work to address?

- Poor academic performance
- School attendance issues
- Withdrawn from friends and/or family
- Emotional, social or behavioral concerns



Who can make a referral?

A referral can be made by parents, school staff or community members.

What happens after a referral is made?

A meeting date will be arranged when the team can meet with the youth and parent(s)/ caregiver(s). At the meeting, the EIT will work with parents/caregivers to discuss strategies that may increase the youth's success.

Members of the EIT will follow-up with the family to assist in goal attainment. Additional meetings may be scheduled if further assistance is needed to ensure success.
